The revenue budget for EMS in 2023 is \$227,000 and we have collected close to \$37,000 over budget with 2 months to go. Also, we had 4 people attend ICS 300 class, which is a command class.

Police - Mark Ross

In the Month of October, the police department handled 95 incidents, that included 7 Felony Arrests, 1 misdemeanor arrest, 5 warrants arrest, and 21 traffic stops with 1 fulltime and 1 part time officer. Last year we handled 120 incidents with two fulltime officers. Out of the 7-felony arrests, there was a Domestic Violence, F/4, and engaging in corrupt activity F/2., the others were Drug possession f/5 charges.

In the first of October, Officer Spung who went to work for ZPD in September, decided to resign his auxiliary commission to fully focus on his new fulltime job. Since Officer Spung departure, we have advertised on our web site, Facebook and sent emails to three different police academies in the surrounding areas for a possible candidate to fill our vacancy. As of today, I have not received any applications nor interest. However, I did have one subject, Kurt Rogers, who works for the postal service, and is an auxiliary with New Straightsville PD. Applied for our auxiliary opening. Rogers has passed the background check and will be sworn in soon. Kurt would have loved to have taken the fulltime position, but he could not leave the postal service due to pay. The search is still on. A suggestion of what we should do about hiring an officer, with the comments on Facebook and nobody applying, we need to get the wage to a minimum of 18.00 an hour. October 31st, trick or treat night, went very well, we had lots of people and children going door to door to our local residences. There were no Incidents reported and interaction with the public was great.

As to Unit S3 the reports I received, during trick or treat night, it continued to overheat and could not be driven around very much. Not sure if we can use it at an intersection during the parade this November.

As to the Levy I had not heard much from the public, so please continue your support. Vote Yes on Tuesday November 7th, 2023. If you have any questions or concerns, please bring them up.

For the month of October we had 42 locates. We are in the process of a new software conversion so I could not get a list of updated work orders. Gas taps have been made at the well field and the water plant for the generators. I am still waiting on AEP for the wellfield regarding the new service hook up.

Since we have had no issues at the intersection of Pembroke and Beechrock with the flashing light I would like to have the permission to take the service out so we do not need to pay the monthly fee for that.

Resolution 1111 (Emergency) A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY TO LEVY AN ADDITIONAL PERMANENT TAX IN EXCESS OF THE TEN-MILL LIMITATION FOR THE FIRE DEPARTMENT, ITS EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES AND AMBULANCE

SERVICES IN THE VILLAGE OH SOUTH ZANESVILLE, OHIO, AND DECLARING IT AN EMERGENCY (RC 5705.19, RC 5705.19(1)(U) AND (W)

Kim asked, "If you had all of these fire hydrants would we need a tanker?" Russel replied, "Yes, we need it for areas without hydrants." Greg asked, "What happened to the old tanker? Are we just giving up on it?" Russell replied, "We have had it looked at several times." Kim asked if we could sell it. Russell expressed several other issues including not finding parts to fix what is wrong with it.

Kim asks if we must make it a permanent levy. Kevin replied that you can specify however long you want or renewable also. Greg made sure that this document is only to certify how much money we would make.

Ed moved to suspense with the three separate readings rules of Resolution 1111 pursuant to statue 731.17 of the Ohio revised codes and declare it an emergency. Seconded by Greg. St. Clair – yay, Harlan – yay, Nunley – yay, and Gibson - yay. Motion Carried.

Mike motioned to pass Resolution 1111. Seconded by Ed. St. Clair – yay, Harlan – yay, Nunley – yay, and Gibson - yay. Motion Carried.
